

## Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

### RESPONSORIAL PSALM: *“My soul thirsts for You, o Lord my God .”*

*In foretelling His sufferings and death, which took place some months later, Christ intended to prepare His disciples and other followers for what He knew would be for them a severe crisis of faith. He also took occasion from it to remind His disciples, and all others who would follow Him, of what their attitude to suffering and death should be. He told them, and us too, that we must be ever ready to accept sufferings in this life, and even an untimely death if that should be demanded of us, rather than deny our Christian faith. To prove their loyalty to their faith in Christ thousands of Christians in the early Church, and thousands more during persecutions in later centuries, gladly took Him at His word and went joyfully to their martyrdom. It is to be hoped that, aided by God's grace, we would all be ready to imitate their example, if called on to prove our fidelity to Christ and our Christian faith. But at the moment what Christ expects and asks of us is that we should bear the sufferings and hardships of daily life cheerfully and gladly for His sake. This daily carrying of our Christian cross can be, and is for many, a prolonged martyrdom. Poverty, ill-health, cruelty and hardheartedness met with in the home and in one's neighbors, are heavy crosses which only a truly Christian shoulder can bear. But, if we were offered health, happiness, peace, wealth and power for the next fifty or seventy years on this earth, in exchange for an eternal heaven after death, what rational one among us would accept that offer? Christians know that this life is a period of training, which makes us ready hereafter to receive the eternal reward which Christ has won for us. Every trainee knows that one must endure certain hardships and sufferings in order to merit graduation into one's chosen profession or trade. On our Christian graduation day we shall, please God, hear the welcome words : "Well done good and faithful servant; because you have been faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater, come and join in your Master's happiness" (Mt. 25: 21). May God grant that every one of us will hear these words of welcome.*

### FIRST FRIDAY, SATURDAY AND SUNDAY OF THE MONTH

This week falls the first Friday, Saturday and Sunday of the month. Friday the Sacrament of reconciliation from 8:00 a.m. and 6:00pm. followed by Holy Mass and a devotion to The Sacred Heart of Jesus. On Saturday we invite all devotees of Our Lady - the Rosary Society, the Knights of the Immaculate and Our Lady of Ludzmiierz Committee to Mass at 8:30p.m followed by devotions.

Today the second collection will be taken for the repayment of the loan taken for the construction of our Church.

### COVID – 19 REMINDER

- Until further notice to provide the church with the required distance of 2 meters between liturgy participants, seats on the benches that indicate where to sit are marked with yellow tape. While entering the bench we take the place starting from the center seat and then we fill up rest of them in such order - it will allow us to get as many people as possible in the church.

- During Holy Communion, everyone comes out of their benches in turn, including those who do not receive the Eucharist. While going to receive communion and keeping a distance of 2 meters, we head towards the minister. When we receive Holy Communion, we stand in the designated place before the priest and after the words Christ's Body we answer Amen. Then, with stretched hands we approach and receive Holy Communion. Until further notice, this is the only form of acceptance of the Holy Communion. Those who do not receive Holy Communion walking in procession, they cross their arms on their chests and receive blessing.

- To increase the number of people who may be in the church, the bench section on the left in the main passage will be reserved for families, as they do not maintain 2 meter social distancing within the same household.

- We only use bathrooms when absolutely necessary

- We encourage you to use a personal disinfectant before entering the church.

- The guidelines strongly emphasize and encourage everyone attending Mass to wear masks for any individual over 3 years old and partially moving them only for the time of receiving Holy Communion.
- The offerings will be collected after the end of Mass. At the exit of the church there will be tables with the baskets for the offerings.
- The bulletins in paper form will not be printed - please read them on the parish website.
- After the Mass, please do not gather for social purposes in the parking lot.
- Please come to church 15 minutes before the start of Mass. to orderly take seats on the benches.
- If you feel sick, e.g. have a fever or cough, or any other symptoms potentially related to COVID, please stay at home.
- The Holy Mass at 11:00 we would like to continue to dedicate to families with children as much as possible, therefore we ask that people without small children choose different Holy Masses to participate.

- Please be advised that until further notice confessions will be held half an hour before morning Mass and one hour prior to the evening Mass.

**- Please be advised that from August 4, the parish office is open to public from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm (break 12:30 pm to 1:30 pm) on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.**

**Notice to Parishioners – New By-Law Requires Mandatory**

**Use of Masks at Church**

As you may have heard in recent days, a new by-law has been passed that makes the use of masks or face coverings inside all public places mandatory. This includes churches and our own parish. I would ask that all those coming to church bring a mask or face covering and wear it upon entering the church. Exceptions to the by-law include people who cannot wear a mask for medical reasons (trouble breathing or unable to remove a mask without assistance) and children under two years old. Proof of a medical condition is not required. Thank you in advance for your co-operation as we do all that we can to take care of one another and keep our community safe and healthy.
