What truly matters is a question of courage: *Do we have it in us, like them, to desire a broader vision and to set out on the journey?* Or are we more like Herod—focused on ourselves, failing to notice the important things happening around us because they seem too small or insignificant to deserve our attention? That is, unless they threaten the carefully constructed image of the world we hold on to.

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

The traditional marking of doors and the accompanying prayer

The Epiphany is one of the oldest feasts of Christianity, known as early as the 3rd century. From the 15th–16th century onward, incense and chalk have been blessed in churches on this day. With blessed chalk, we mark the doors of our homes as a sign that we have welcomed the Incarnate Son of God into our dwelling.

On the door, we write the letters **K + M + B**, referring to the names of the Magi, or C + M + B, which are the initial letters of the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat* — "May Christ bless this home." Usually, the current year is included as well.

The meaning of this custom is explained by the prayer that traditionally accompanies it:

"We ask You, Lord, to visit this home and drive far from it all the snares of the enemy. Let Your holy Angels dwell here and keep us in peace, and may Your blessing always remain with us. Through Christ our Lord. Amen."

May the Almighty and Merciful God bless and protect us: the Father ☩, the Son ☩, and the Holy Spirit ☩. Amen."
